4. Reserves Allocations

A proposed change in 23/24 is to take the intermittent costs, eg ham maintenance and projects, from a reserve not a budget heading. It is hoped that this will add clarity and reduce my work. Scribe can attach multiple cost centres to one reserve. Only one reserve can be added to a cost centre. If a cost centre is linked to a reserve, all payment for that cost centre come out of that reserve.

It is recommended that councils hold between 3 and 12 months worth of un-earmarked reserves. A larger council may be closer to 3 months, a smaller council closer to 12 months. DPC decided during 2022 that holding six months reserves was appropriate. The unearmarked reserves requirement is a judgment for DPC to make based on its circumstances, not a precise figure.

Purpose of earmarked reserves - unexpected call on funds (e.g. churchyard), scheduled replacement Purpose of unearmarked reserves - cash flow/unexpected expenditure.

Reserves Headings

The discussion group suggested renaming and reallocating **current** reserve funds as follows.

This is intended to better understand the anticipated use of these reserves. The same headings be used for a list of projects.

23/24 Reserve allocation

Adding together the contribution to reserves required for the initial list of projects required a precept of 20,000 which was clearly not acceptable. The group reviewed the projects and the reserve requirements and allocations. The proposed funds the most important and "defendable" projects, without increasing the precept.

DPC does not yet have quotes for options to do work on the Jubilee Steps or the slippery path to Dittisham Mill Creek. In discussions with the contractor – the installation of a railing down the Steps might cost £4,000. The path is harder to estimate even roughly – making the surface rougher, which might not help the problem, might cost £3-5,000. Therefore if DPC was to decide it wishes to carry out these projects it would **not** have sufficient in the proposed earmarked reserves. Unearmarked reserves could be used if that was agreed appropriate by DPC.

I also note that the sick leave reserve is an estimate to fund the liability based on my pay. Locum hourly rates are higher but complete absence from work not likely.

5. 23/24 Precept Calculations

The calculation above result in a precept of 12,709.

In 22/23 Dittisham was 51st in a list of 61 Town and Parish Council precepts. Most of its income comes from the car parks.

Increase in precept demand by £2,000 would cost each (Band D equivalent) household £5.50/year.

23/24 Precept Options proposed:

- 1. Leave precept at £12,000
- 2. Increase precept to £14,000 and allocate additional £2,000 to Parish Health & Safety reserve.
